



New Septic Facility in Clearwater

TNRD and District of Clearwater partner on Septic Facility

Infrastructure Investments are an important driver of economic growth and job creation. The Thompson Nicola Regional District (TNRD) and the District of Clearwater have formed a partnership through a grant from the Federal Gas Tax Strategic Priorities Fund to construct a septage receiving station in Clearwater. This new septage facility will help protect the environment and the health of North Thompson Valley residents.

Until recently, septic was stored at landfills in Blue River, Clearwater and Barriere. With the TNRD closing these facilities in favour of eco-depots, the waste would instead be shipped to a landfill in Hefley Creek. The facility built in Clearwater will be used to treat sludge that has been pumped from septic tanks.

This septage management facility is located near the present sewage lagoons. At 385 Webber Road. The facilities will support and minimize costs to the home owner for their septic waste disposal and creates less impact on the environment.

The Facility is now in operation from early March to November— hours of operation are 7:00 am to 7:00 pm Monday to Friday.

The facility was opened May 1, 2016.
